#### A Ballad to a Traitor




Of the twenty-one short essays covering variety of interesting historical events in Sri Lanka; the title of which, creates a puzzle in reader's mind. Where is the ballad? Who is the traitor? The author has gone into the lost past, a couple of centuries back and has attempted to do justice to history buried under the dust of antiquity. There are so many such interesting historical pieces he had written about, time to time over the past decades, but unfortunately the readers have lost easy access to them. Compiling them into a profound book is an enormous task and will last for the future generations of enthusiasts in history as an informative document for which Dr. Sarath Edirisinghe's efforts deserve much appreciation. A medical historian, a rare trait

he possesses, not only an avid reader, Sarath Edirisinghe is an impressive writer. His favorable characters in the book are Robert Knox, King Rajasimha II, Rebeiro, King Sri Vikrama Rajasimha, Queen Dona Catharina to mention a few and there are many more beginnings from the ancient kingdom of Anuradhapura to the British period. The reader can catch glimpses of history from this analytical text written in scholarly English language. The chapter titled "Food and Culinary Habits of the Kandyan Peasantry in the Seventeenth Century Through the Eyes of Robert Knox" is tongue wetting. Dr. Sarath Edirisinghe, graduated from the Peradeniya Medical School in 1968 and served his alma mater as a Medical Parasitology teacher till his retirement as a Merit Professor in 2007 and later served as a Senior Consultant to the Faculty of Medicine, Rajarata University. I feel honored to Write this brief review about a book of this prolific writer of our time.


#### You and Your Mental Health



"You and Your Mental Health" is a book written by Dr Devasmika Ariyasinghe, Senior Lecturer, Department of Psychiatry, Faculty of Medicine, University of Peradeniya and an alumnus of the 95/96 batch. Here, she reflects on her book.

"'You and Your Mental Health' is a work of about 5 years. Whenever, which is most of the time, I found how uninformed the public is on mental health and related issues, I repent that I could not complete this book, which would have helped at least few of those clients; by helping them to realize that that they need

help, having a mental illness is not something to be embarrassed about, the importance of involving in healthy life style in maintaining mental wellbeing. The book is in two parts: The first part talks about brain and mind, sleep, human sexuality and sexual health, couple relationship, stress, parenting, thinking styles and healthy ageing; The second part describes common mental illnesses; depression, alcohol abuse, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, phobias, obsessive compulsive disorder and dementia. The same book is available in Sinhala as 'ඔබ සහ ඔබගේ මානසික සෞඛායේ The Sinhala book has gone for second print within a period of three months, which is an indication that the book is well received. I also think that the book will be helpful to medical professionals, especially for those who have not done a professorial appointment in psychiatry to look at patients with mental health problems with better understanding. It will be helpful for medical students as well, since the issues related to mental health and mental illnesses are described in the local context."





Omesh Shehan, a fourth-year medical student of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Peradeniya, uses poetry as his tool to sketch out the various thoughts and feelings that cross the mind of both a poet and a medical student. His first book, "Gatambe ahasa yata" is a collection of short poems written in his mother tongue, which take the reader on a rhythmic journey while enwreathing them in the folds of modern Sinhalese literature. ## A tribute to the dearly departed

#### Prof. Eugene Wickramanayake

Professor Eugene Wickramanayake's sudden death a few months back leaves a hiatus in the academic world.

She had a voracious thirst for knowledge and was a constant presence at lectures and seminars in the medical and scientific field in all genres. Prof. Wickremanayake joined the Anatomy Department of the newly established medical college in Peradeniya in the early 60's and was subsequently appointed Professor. She retired in 1999. She was a dedicated teacher and researcher with many papers to her credit. Her last project was a genetic study of the Dambana Veddahs (genetics was her chosen field of specialization).

As Emeritus professor, she made it a point to visit the Anatomy Department once a month, despite living in Colombo.

She had a brilliant academic career both in school and in the medical college, and was the first female to enter the Medical College from the Central Province. This was in 1952,

As a friend for almost a life-time, I realized she had those rare qualities—a generosity of spirit and an all-encompassing humanity. She will be sorely missed by her family, friends and past students.

#### Prof. S. B. P. Athauda

Late Prof. Athauda, lovingly referred to as Parakrama, was the fourth sibling born to a well-established professional family from Mawanella. After a near perfect early education at the Kegalu Maha Vidyalaya, he graduated from the University of Peradeniya with honours in chemistry. He joined the Biochemistry Department, of the Faculty of Medicine as an academic in 1984 at an early age, and later obtained his PhD degree in 1992 from the University of Tokyo, working on 'gut acid proteinases'. After returning to Sri Lanka, he continued to work on other acid proteinases including those of HIV, trying to discover natural inhibitors, including those from 'bandurd', that could destroy targeted proteinase activity.

He was associated with large numbers of local and foreign funded research projects that resulted in promoting a research culture among young scientists. This is amply illustrated by the large numbers of MSc, MPhil and PhD research students he supervised and published in numerous refereed local and foreign journals. He was a visiting scientist and senior research fellow of many universities in the world, including those of Japan and UK.

He greatly helped the Department of Biochemistry to uplift academic levels of scientific knowledge in biochemistry and molecular biology, by being an active participant in establishing new postgraduate courses – namely Advanced Biochemistry I & II, Clinical Biochemistry and Experimental Biotechnology at the Postgraduate Institute of Science. He did this while attending to the prime duty of teaching biochemistry relevant to medical students in the Faculty of Medicine in Peradeniya.

All his work came to a sudden halt when he was 48 years, following a tragic accident in December 2010 that resulted in his demise in November 2019. He was appointed a Professor in Biochemistry in October 2009 and continued in this post until his medical retirement. -Emeritus Prof. P A J Perera

#### Dr. Thilak de Silva

Dr. Thilak de Silva who passed away about an year ago, was my batch mate and I am honoured to write this appreciation about him. He entered the Faculty of Medicine, Peradeniya in 1964 from Sri Sumangala College, Panadura and passed out as a doctor in 1969. He was a very friendly character who was loved by all in the batch and he used to entertain us with his jokes during free times when in company.

He took up obstetrics and gynaecology as a specialty. He worked as an obstetrician and gynaecologist at Teaching Hospital Kandy and was involved in teaching medical students of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Peradeniya for many years. Thilak was a very friendly colleague and we got along well as work mates at Teaching Hospital Kandy. He was liked very much by the staff of the operating theaters and the patients, because of his pleasing manners. He was well known for the accuracy of his ultrasound findings of patients. Later he changed his specialty to become a consultant in accident and emergency medicine in the UK. Thilak did his duty to the country as a doctor and a human being.

May he attain the bliss of Nibbana early in his journey through samsara.

#### Dr Neil Halpe

#### Dr Gamini Buthpitiya

Together with his general passion for life, Buttha (as he was known) was one of the best clinicians of his time and his pioneering work on the pharyngeal pump is well recognized. If I'm not mistaken, he is probably the only surgeon in Sri Lanka whose work is quoted in the famous textbook, "Bailey & Love – Short Practise of Surgery".

He was not just a clinician but was a committed environmentalist too.

I think many would agree that he was one of the best to hold the post of Dean and certainly one of the most charismatic Deans of Peradeniya. He was the incumbent Dean when the Faculty celebrated its Golden Jubilee and made us all proud of being members of the Faculty.

I will finish by letting Buttha have the last word. This was his ending to the note he wrote for to my wife and myself, on our 35th wedding anniversary album:


